

Why greenwashing emerged

- Governmental push
 - Due to the Circular procurement in the Netherlands (pioneer)
 - Greenwashing emerged
 - Need for a set of rules on circular textiles
- NEN created on demand of the industry the Norm commission Circular **Textile** Interreg European Linion
 - NTA 8195 Circular textile Requirements and categories
 - Input material classification
 - Use Recycle Remanufacture Repair Reuse
 - Source Pre consumer Post production material Post production waste Open loop

North-West Europe

- Certification scheme
- A Technical agreement (TA) in stead of a NEN
 - There was a high need Goes faster
 - New theme and little knowledge Easier to adapt



International trade - CEN

- The NTA 8195 was then presented to the TC 248 Textiles and Textile products
 - It was translated from Dutch terminology errors due to a double translation
- Decided to start a new working group WG 39
- Alignment Many meetings and many new experts needed
 - Many discussions on the need of the standards
 - Huge discussion on the terminology Vienna agreement ISO
 - Result the structure of the standards to be developed changed
- Main reason
 - The lack of knowledge
 - Resist change
 - Own agendas



EU policy

Key actions in the Textiles Strategy



Set **design requirements for textiles** to make them last longer, easier to repair and recycle, as well as requirements on minimum recycled content



Introduce clearer information and a **Digital Product Passport**



Tackle greenwashing to empower consumers and raise awareness about sustainable fashion



Reverse **overproduction and overconsumption**, and **discourage** the
destruction of unsold or returned textiles



Propose mandatory Extended Producer
Responsibility for textiles with ecomodulation of fees



Address the **unintentional release of microplastics** from synthetic textiles



Restrict the **export of textile waste** and promote sustainable textiles globally



Incentivise **circular business models**, inlcuding reuse and repair sectors



Encourage companies and Member States to **support the objectives** of the Strategy



Circulaire economie

- CEN TC 248 WG 39 Textiles Circular Economy for textile products and the textile chain
 - NTA 8195 split up:
 - Draft ISO/WD 5157 Textiles Environmental Aspects Vocabulary
 - ISO/TC 038/WG 35 "Environmental aspects"
 - Vienna Agreement
 - Part 1: General principles and guidance
 - Part 2: Categorization of and requirements on non-virgin input materials
 - Part 3: Design for circularity
 - Part 4: Product information/ Digital product passport (on hold)
 - 3 Minimum Quality standards perhaps different levels
 - Minimum Quality for Clothing
 - Minimum Quality for Workwear



Minimum Quality for bath, bed and kitchen textiles

What did I learn

- Look at the need from the industry!
- Get new stakeholder on board from the start
 - Analyze the expert's background what is missing
 - Invite new experts yourself
- Look at what the EU policy on the topic
 - Try to predict their needs
- Inform the experts
 - Give presentations to bring the experts up to speed on the topic
- Research projects can deliver important information
 - Interreg Circtex and H2020 tExtended
 - Product passport

- Liaisons with other TC's
 - Other standards are useful and can be implemented
- Work together with ISO
 - Terminology look at other standards in CEN and ISO – align as much as possible!
- Choose for a TS in stead of an EN, you will need to adapt as much as possible
- Don't integrate circularity aspects in standards with other topics
 - Develop separate standard that can rereferred to implemented in the existing standards
- Difficult topic! Need for physical meetings
